




- Employment decreased 3 percent in the Denver South region between 2019 and 2020, with about 7,200 fewer jobs.
- From 2012 to 2020, the Denver South region's employment growth averaged 2.5 percent per year, higher than Metro Denver's average (2 percent).



Current Employment

- Employment in the Denver South region fell
 2.5 percent between the first quarters of 2020
 and 2021, with nearly 6,160 fewer workers over the period. However, employment rose 0.3 percent between the fourth quarter of 2020 and the first quarter of 2021.
 - Metro Denver employment declined 4.4 percent over-the-year, which was 1.9 percentage points below the rate posted in the Denver South region.
- Six of the 12 supersectors in the Denver South region reported over-the-year increases, with the largest increases recorded in transportation, warehousing and utilities (+16.3 percent) and construction (+9.1 percent).







- Only two of the 12 supersectors in Metro Denver recorded an overthe-year increase in employment. Transportation, warehousing and utilities (+4.6 percent) and financial activities (+0.3 percent) recorded increases.
- Professional and business services was the largest employment supersector in


Wages


Historic Wages

- The average annual salary in the Denver South region for all industries rose 2.7 percent per year from 2012 to 2020, while the average annual salary in Metro Denver (3.5 percent) grew at a faster pace.
- Since 2012, the average annual salaries in the Denver South region have averaged about \$18,000 higher than Metro Denver.

Current Wages

- The average weekly wage for all industries in the Denver South region was 5.3 percent higher in the first quarter of 2021, compared with one-year earlier.
- The average weekly wage for all industries was nearly \$520 higher in the Denver South region in the first quarter of 2021, compared with Metro Denver.
 - Workers in the mining and logging and information supersectors in the Denver South region earned the highest average annual weekly wages, receiving \$4,340 per week and \$3,520 per week, respectively.







- Leisure and hospitality recorded the lowest annual salary at \$710. Metro Denver reported similar trends in the first quarter of 2021.
- Seven of the 12 supersectors earned more than \$1,500 per week in the Denver South region in the first quarter of 2021.



Labor Force and Unemployment

- The labor force increased in all areas between the first quarters of 2020 and 2021, led by the City and County of Denver (+1.8 percent) and Arapahoe County (+1.5 percent).
 - Metro Denver's labor force rose 1.1 percent over-the-year.
- While the current unemployment rates in all areas remain high compared to their prepandemic levels, the unemployment rates are declining from their record levels in 2Q 2020. Unemployment rates were historically low pre-pandemic.
 - The unemployment rates were at least 2.5 percentage points higher than one-year earlier in all areas. The City and County of Denver recorded the highest unemployment rate of 7.4 percent in the first quarter of 2021, which was 3.9 percentage points higher than one-year earlier.





Largest Employers

The Denver South region is the home of seven *Fortune* 1,000

headquarters.

to the region from the surrounding communities including Denver (17 percent) and Aurora (12.7 percent).

- Similarly, of the residents in the Denver South region who commuted elsewhere for work, the largest proportion commute to Denver (25.4 percent) and Centennial (8.5 percent).
- Of the population employed within the Denver South region, 21.1 percent also live within the region, while 78.9 percent live outside the region.
